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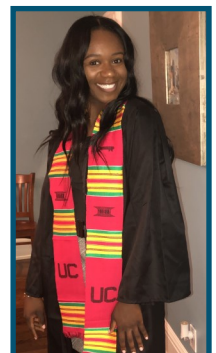
Leadership Thoughts

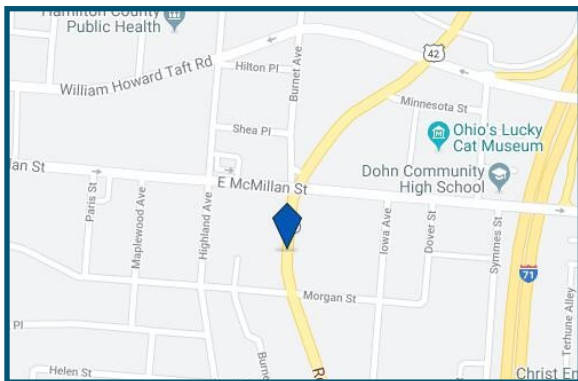

BHGH Expands With a New Mentor Program

Leadership Scholars, now a part of Boys Hope Girls Hope, is an organization where 35 high school students mentor 41 seventh grade students once a week on two main topics: college knowledge and mindset. Summit juniors and seniors travel to two schools in Cincinnati: Corryville Catholic and St. Francis de Sales. At these schools, leaders are matched with one or two scholars, and will stay with them for the duration of the year. Leaders work to build personal connections and relationships with their scholars, in order to be a positive influence on them and guide them in school and on their paths to college. Leadership Scholars has five core areas they cover, including mindfulness, grit, positive outlook, social intelligence, and college knowledge.

Many positive relationships were built between leaders and scholars at De Sales within one month of meeting each other. Leader Melina said, “My favorite thing about leadership scholars is the opportunity to have a positive influence on younger kids, get closer with my scholar, and help her succeed.”

Scholar Ziarya said, “One thing I like about Mariah is that she is nice, helpful, careful, and she is communicative.”

Scholar Jariatou shared, “I love my leader Katie because she is easy to talk to, I can trust her, she’s nice, she’s very funny, she’s awesome... and I love her energy.”

The students at Corryville have also had an amazing time getting to know their leaders and building new relationships with them. Even after just one month of being together, the leaders and scholars had no problem expressing how happy they were during their time together. Leader Matthew shared his thoughts about his relationship with his scholar just after the first day: “I felt like we really connected and got to learn a lot about each other’s lives. We already have so much in common.” One can already tell that these relationships are not strictly for the classroom, but friendships that will continue throughout the year.



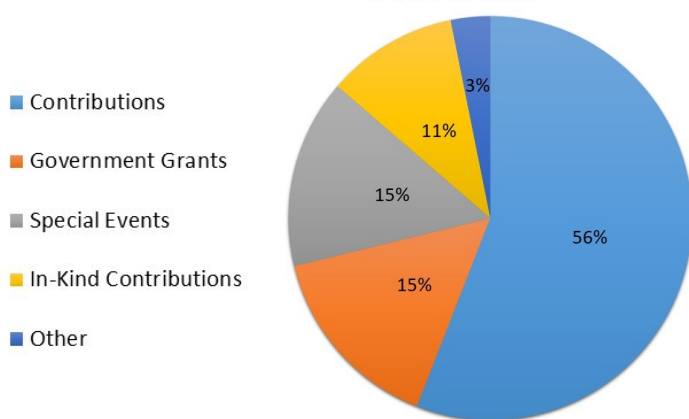

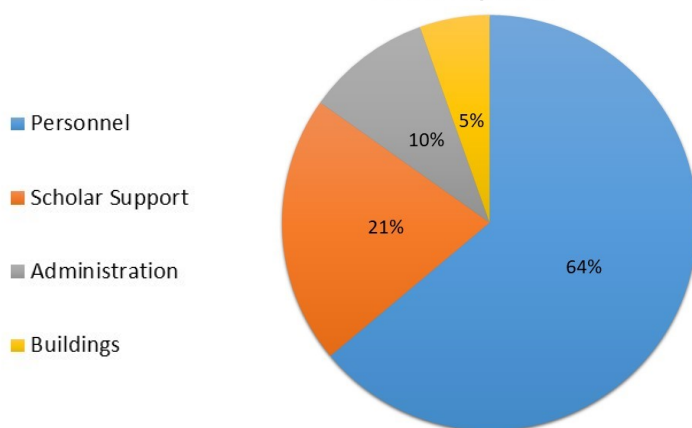
Leaders and scholars begin their session at St. Francis de Sales in mindfulness meditation.
